"With Firm Hearts We Abide the Issue," Declares the Premier

"Our Answer is 'Ready, Aye, Ready' Says Sir Wilfrid. Our Appeal is to the God of Justice and Mercy—Hospital is Offered to France.

Ottawa, Aug. 20.—Canada speaks with one voice. The voice of a united Parliament is the voice of a united people. "As to our duty all are agreed. We stand shoulder to shoulder with the Mother Country, with firm hearts we abide the issue," said Sir Robert Borden, in concluding the debate on the address in reply to the speech from the Throne in Parliament yesterday.

Von Tirpitz, Who Rules The Navy

The man who must meet the Russian, English and Japanese enemies of Germany on the seas is Grand Admiral von Tirpitz, head of the Kaisers navy. A man of comparatively humble birth, born 65 years ago, he entered the royal Prussian navy when he was only 16, cruising in the Baltic, the North Sea, the Mediterranean and the Atlantic Ocean, and rising to the grade of second lieutenant in time to serve in the Franco-Prussian war on board the Koenig Wilhelm.
