Lorne bridge. This would be a great convenience as, at present, the bridge is very poorly lighted.

T. L. Brown, secretary of the Hamilton Board of Trade, wished to know in his communication, when the invitation extended to official representatives of the municipality in connection with the Town Planning conference, would be considered. The Mayor suggested that this matter should be given immediate attention, and appointed Ald. Pitcher to choose a committee to take charge of the affair.

Albert Tomlinson requested that the laying of the concrete sidewalk on the east side of Lyons avenue from Margaretta street to the city limits be delayed in its construction as there are no houses on that street at present.

The Thew Automatic Shovel Co. wished to explain their latest excavating machine to the city and enclosed a plan of the machine.

It was moved by Ald. Minshall that the communication of A. F. Dell and the Brantford Hydro Electric Co., be referred to the Fire and Light Committee. Carried.

Ald. Calbeck moved that the time sheets of the City Engineer and the communications from the Thew Automatic Shovel Co., Albert Tomlinson, Angus Wilson and D. Webster, be referred to the Board of Works. Carried.

Ald. Bragg read a communication from the Hydro Electric Railway union requesting that the city's membership be removed from the Hydro Electric and other companies could put their poles on Water street. The unsightly poles should certainly be removed off the street.

The Mayor thought that a committee to consider this same question had been appointed a couple of years ago.

Ald. Calbeck said that if it was left to the Board of Works they would do their best to make the removal possible.

Ald. Ryerson asked if Water street had been oiled.
Ald. Calbeck replied that it had and that the Motor Club had kindly consented to pay for the oiling of all hills on main roads leading into the city.

Ald. Cuff asked if the Mt. Pleasant road could be oiled. Ald. Calbeck stated that it would be soon.

To Alderman Cuff's question about what had been done about the gas, the Mayor replied that he had written that afternoon to Mr. F. Lowery, of Ottawa about the question, and if his reply would be unsatisfactory, the city solicitor would act for the taking over of the Gas Company.
Adjournment at 9.30 p.m.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land by each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.
The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
