

Madrid, via Paris, June 18.—A movement for a radical rebuilding of the whole political edifice in Spain is gaining adherents everywhere. "Early this morning the enemy delivered a strong local attack, under cover of a heavy fire upon the positions captured by us on the morning of June 14, east of Nancy le Pruch. After fighting our troops were compelled to fall back from certain advanced points which had been established by us in front of our main new positions, which we still hold on Infanty Hill.
