A Golden Wedding

At Glen Ewen, on April 21st, Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Arnold, of Glen Ewen, celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary, having been married at Athens, Ont., in 1870. H. B. Arnold, the second son, and family, of Vancouver, B.C., were unable to attend on account of the distance. The other two sons, B. W. Arnold and family, of Estevan, were present, as were also Mr. A. E. Grey, eldest brother of Mrs. Arnold, and John E. Arnold, of Oxbow, cousin of the groom. W. E. Arnold, the eldest grandson, and wife, at present of Oxbow, were present, and also Mr. and Mrs. Beaman, of Lauderdale, Man., friends of the family. Other relatives living near were unable to attend owing to the inclemency of the weather.

The house was tastefully decorated with daffodils, carnations and roses. At one o'clock all sat down to a sumptuous feast, the fitting climax of which was the cutting of the three-story, bride's cake decorated in white and gold by the bride of fifty years ago. Many beautiful presents were received, among which were a gold-lined tea set with tray, gold-lined cream and sugar set, gold vase, gold decorated bronze nut bowl, five dollar gold piece, a gold-lined berry spoon, a check, sofa cushion, hand bag and several other articles.

The afternoon was spent in receiving friends from the town and congratulations by phone and talk of the days that are gone.

The bride, whose maiden name

was Violetta Grey, was born at Addison, Ont., 1848, where she spent practically all her life until coming west to Glen Elbe in 1906 to the farm south of town, where she and her husband resided until 1917, when they retired, moving to Glen Ewen to spend the autumn of life.

The groom was born in 1848 in the County of Kitley, Ont., where he learned the trade of carpenter. He followed his trade for a number of years in various places, one being an American factory where he made gun stocks during the civil war. In 1900 he became interested in the western country and bought land at Esby, N.D., and later seven quarters south of Glen Ewen on the international boundary. Since retiring from the farm Mr. Arnold has engaged in the feed and coal business.

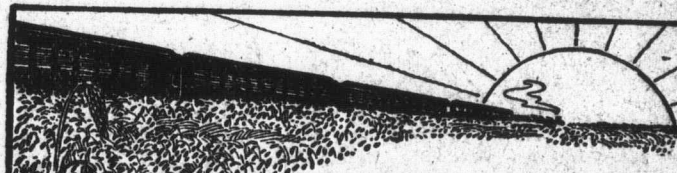
