MARTIAL LAW IN BELFAST.

Soldiers Take Possession of Streets Carrying Ball Cartridges.

Belfast, Ireland, Aug. 8.—Troops took possession of the streets of Belfast yesterday morning and strong guards were posted at custom house square and other centres.

Thousands of citizens watched with mixed feelings, the inauguration of military control of the city as a result of the strikes and insubordination of the police.

The soldiers will carry ball cartridges, and there are some fears that this practical placing of the city under martial law may precipitate a crisis.

The plan is to have the soldiers perform police duty in order to enable forces of constabulary to be told off to protect the conveyance of merchandise to and from the docks.

The city has been divided since the division of the city into five divisions, each under control of a battalion of infantry.

The city is quiet. The strike pickets turned out as usual yesterday morning, but they were inactive.

The day passed in absolute quietude. The effect of the presence of the troops on the business streets of the city was most excellent. Some of the mills and factories that had closed were re-opened and others announce that they will re-open to-day.

More goods have been moved from the docks than on any day since the docks began, and it is apparent that the strike of the carters will collapse speedily.

MUST GET A LICENSE.

U. S. Fishermen Get Same Privileges as Britishers.

Washington, Aug. 8.—The State Department yesterday received a communication from Ambassador Bryce in connection with the seizure and release last spring in the Gulf of St. Lawrence of the American fishing schooner Alert, engaged in trap net fishing.

The ambassador says that the action of the Canadian authorities in that case was taken solely with a view to the preservation of the fisheries and no question of nationality was involved.

In order to prevent further friction instructions have been sent to the local authorities not to interfere with trap nets set by American fishermen in cases where a license would not be refused to a British fisherman even though the special license has not already been taken out.

The ambassador says that the Dominion Government hopes that American fishermen will be requested to apply for license and not proceed to fish without them inasmuch as they will be issued on the same conditions as to British fishermen.

The State Department regards this outcome as most satisfactory and is gratified at the attitude of the Dominion authorities.

TURKISH INVASION OF PERSIA.

Christian Village Shelled, Many Killed and Girls Carried Off.

Teheran, Persia, Aug. 8.—Turkish troops which recently crossed the northwest frontier of Persia, are marching on Urumiah, burning and devastating villages along their route.

The Christian village of Ewan is reported to have been shelled and 90 persons, including many women and children, are said to have been killed. Then girls were carried off.

The Government is consulting with the foreign representatives regarding the Turkish invasion.

Persia Appeals to Russia.

St. Petersburg, Aug. 8.—Persia has asked the assistance of the Russian Foreign Office toward a settlement of her dispute with Turkey over Persia's frontier.

PRINCE KILLED IN WRECK.

Passenger Train Derailed in Germany—Death List of Eleven.

Berlin, Aug. 8.—A passenger train was derailed Tuesday night between Posen and Thorn. The two engines were overturned, three cars were demolished.

The official reports says that eleven persons were killed and ten were injured.

Among the dead are Prince Alexander Begoff, two sons of Count Keyserling, of Mittan, Russia, and a Russian captain, who was accompanying them.

Venezuela Will Pay.

Caracas, Venezuela, via Willemstad, Curacao, Aug. 8.—Venezuela advised Belgian last Wednesday, July 31, that in recognition of the principle of arbitration she would pay the disputed claims of Belgian creditors, amounting to \$2,000,000, in conformity with the decision of The Hague's tribunal.

Nuns Will Teach.

Ottawa, Aug. 8.—The Grey Nuns have offered to supply the vacancies on the teaching staff of the separate school board, made by the departure of the Christian brothers, who will not qualify under the Ontario regulations.

Shoots Himself.

Pittsburg, Aug. 8.—George W. Dalmatar, a Republican candidate for governor in 1891, committed suicide in his office in the Diamond National Bank building yesterday afternoon.

Broke Jail.

New Hamburg, Aug. 8.—John Martin, one of two men arrested Tuesday for breaking into the Grand Trunk station, made his escape from the village lockup Tuesday night.

\$5,000,000 for Pictures.

London, Aug. 8.—Duveen Bros. of London have purchased for \$5,000,000 the famous collection of pictures and treasures of the late Rudolph Kann, the Paris financier.

Killed by Lightning.

Montreal, Aug. 8.—Edward Roy, a farmer, while haying on his farm at La Prairie, near Montreal, yesterday afternoon, was struck by lightning and instantly killed.
