LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS.

The Canada Gazette contains a proclamation calling the Dominion Parliament to meet on Thursday, March 16th.

JOHN MCGINLEY, laborer, while at work on the steamer Coban, at St. John, N. B., on Saturday last received injuries from which he died on Monday.

Mr. PHILIP D. AMOR, of Chicago, has given \$75,000 to the endowment fund of the Armour Institute of that city.

El Heraldo, of Madrid, says that at the conclusion of the peace debate, the new ministry formed by Senor Moron Rios will be constituted with the cooperation of Senor Gamaza.

JOHNSON, of Indiana, member of the House of Representatives, on the 24th, made a scathing attack on the President of the U. S. and the Administration impugning the motives which controlled them and predicting their collapse.

The schooner Omega, Captain McDonald, left St. John's on Saturday 11th. On the 13th, while running before a northerly gale, George Kelly, of Louisburg, was washed overboard and drowned...

In view of circumstances that have come to the attention of the authorities at New Britain, Conn., it is believed that Lucia Bennett, aged 50 years, and her daughter Carrie, aged 40, who reside in Berlin, have been starving themselves, although alleged to be worth between \$50,000 and \$75,000.

The schr. Mary P., Captain James Benoit, is reported to have sailed on the western coast of the Island of Curacao, near Venezuela. The Mary P. was on her way from Barbadoes to Curacao to load for the former port.

Immense damage has been done at Manila by fire believed to have been started by the insurgents. There was fighting in the streets lately but the Americans quelled the uprising.

A DEATH lately occurred under singular circumstances at Bristol, Ont. Four years ago Alice Francombe, a child 7 years of age, swallowed a halfpenny. At a later date she was subjected to the Booniger rays, with the view to finding the whereabouts of the coin, but without success.

An Ottawa despatch says—Japan will retaliate against Canada if the British Columbia Exclusion Act is enforced, said Shaw T. Nishimur, of Yokohama, in an interview.

The Stanley as stated in our last issue, left Georgetown for Pictou on Tuesday of last week, but did not arrive at Pictou, till Wednesday evening.

LE SOIR, of Paris, announced on the 29th, that Mr. Madas, Procurator General would submit his report in the Dreyfus affair this week. The report will be the Court of Cassation if it is expected to annul the conviction without ordering a new trial.

A CARRIAGE from Admiral Dewey asking for the Oregon was received with surprise by the officials at Washington on the 24th. No one knows the nature of the political reasons which the Admiral says demands the immediate presence of the battleship.

LONDON advices of the 25th say—Khalifa has left Shookel, and is moving northward with a considerable force. He has been constantly retreating the last along the route he is following, and the latter have become panic-stricken.

REYDARD KIRLING, the celebrated writer, is very ill of pneumonia in New York City.

The British Columbia Legislature prorogued last night, after the shortest session on its record.

OTAWA advises say that it is expected a Maritime Province officer will get the command of the Hsley Team.

A MANILA despatch says Admiral Dewey declines to give his reasons for requesting the warship Oregon to be sent thither.

JAMES MCSHANE of Montreal, is looking for the Postmaster of that city, in succession to Danstear, who has resigned.

Dr. RIMBERT, G. M. P., is to receive the position of quarantine officer, and was at Ottawa on Monday in connection therewith.

A WASHINGTON despatch of the 27th, says officials there discredit the statement that foreign warships are disembarking troops at Manila.

The mails via the Capes were very irregular last week. There was no crossing on Friday or Saturday in consequence of the storm and lolly.

The Copenhagen correspondent of the London Daily Mail says that well informed persons there assert that the health of Emperor Nicholas is far from good and that his condition excites the gravest solicitude.

MADRID advices of the 27th contain the following: An official despatch from Manila says that the situation there is very severe. Foreign warships are disembarking troops. General Rios will leave Manila and go to Seemboang Island, Mindano.

The second sermon of the Lenten course was preached in St. Peter's Cathedral, on Sunday evening last, by Rev. Father Johnston. His theme was: "Are the Bishops of Rome the successors of St. Peter?"
