#### The Waterworks. To the Editor of The Signal.

DEAR SIR,—Having been requested by different parties to give a statement by different particles at some of the statements in your "hy draulic engineer's" report; for instance the amount of water per head for each inhabitant, viz.: 25 gallons. Just think of a family of ten persons using daily 250 gallons, or seven barrels! Other places are satisfied, and find they have an abundance of water for all purposes, fire protection included, with from 7 to 9 gallons per head. Then again, he says the cemetery spring was only running at the rate of 25,000 to 30,000 gallons per day. One would think that a pretty small stream to run a mill with ; but it only shows the value of some such reports. Now the actual measurement of the natural stream, taken when at about its lowest, was thus taken: The stream was passed through a chute turned into a barrel of 41 imperial gallons. This was filled in 14 seaonds, which would give 10,544 gallons per hour, or 253,056 gallons a day. This would give a population of 5,000 inhabitants a water supply of about  $50\frac{1}{3}$  gallons per head, or 25 gallons per head for 10,000 inhabitants, an over sufficient supply for many years. We would say no town in Canada has at its doors a more easily constructed, natural supply of good pure water than Goderich, if only properly applied. Yours very truly, E. McCANN.


