MANUFACTURERS TALK ABOUT TARIFF

Abandon the Idea of Conducting Educational Campaign to Enlighten the Farmers.

Vancouver, B.C., Sept. 21.—Practically rejecting a resolution to conduct a campaign of education along tariff policy lines, but at the same time expressing a hope that the Dominion government will not overtake the present fiscal arrangements in favor of those more radically making for free trade the Canadian Manufacturers' association today debated the most important feature of the present tariff with respect to free trade and protection.

Only one business session was held today. Three will be held tomorrow, following the election of officers and members of the executive council, ballot for which have already been issued. Nathaniel Curry, of Montreal, and J. P. Murray, of Toronto, are nominated for the vice-presidency, an office which is usually held by the president.

SPANISH TOWN FLOODED DUE TO VIOLENT STORMS

Madrid, Spain, Sept. 21.—Violent storms accompanied by deluges of rain, have done great damage to vine yards and olive orchards in southern Spain. Eight villages, including Lores and Cleza are under water from three to six feet deep. The lower section of Barcelona is flooded and the tramway service in that part of the city is interrupted. The waters have reached the altars of St. Aza church. At Torre de Establan, in the province of Toledo, an almost unprecedented hailstorm is reported.
