MONTEREAL, April 27.
Nearly a score of prostrations as a result of April heat, were reported on Saturday at the city hospitals.

NEW YORK April 27.
Sir Cecil Arthur Spring Rice, K.C. M.G., the new British Ambassador to the States, arrived here to-day on board the Cunard steamer Carmania.

LONDON, April 27.
The arson squad set fire to an empty train standing on a siding of the South Western Railway at Teddington-on-Thames, this morning. The usual combustibles and concomitant rubbish. Little damage. No arrests.

LONDON, April 27.
Anxiety is caused by the condition of the Duchess of Connaught. A bulletin issued by the Surgeons in attendance says: "The Duchess passed a somewhat restless night. The improvement observed during the past few days has not been maintained."

CETTINJE, April 27.
In celebration of the capture of Scutari by King Nicholas, he has liberated the men who were implicated in the conspiracy to murder him in 1909. Those convicted included former Premier Radovich, who is related to the King by marriage. Juvanovics escaped from jail by tunnelling under the structure, but Radovich, who was in the plot, failed to get away.

BRUSSELS, April 27.
The equal suffrage strike is ended in most of the industrial towns. In the provinces a good many miners still refuse to descend into the coal pits, but it is thought that by Monday all will obey the orders of the National Socialist Congress. Competent economists reckon the money loss caused by the strike at \$20,000,000, which the Socialist leaders declare to have been well lost, if the country has thereby won equal suffrage.

ROME, April 27.
The departure of Angelo Sarro, brother of the Pope, from the Vatican, is regarded as confirmation of the reported continued improvement in the condition of the Supreme Pontiff. Later the Pope was allowed by his doctors to stand behind the windows of his bedroom and watch the American pilgrims crossing the Square of St. Peter's, to enter the bronze door of the Vatican for reception by Cardinal Merry del Val, Papal Secretary of State.

NEW YORK, April 27.
Dr. Friedmann has arranged the sale of his anti-tuberculosis vaccine for \$125,000 in cash, and \$1,800,000 in stock in thirty-six Friedmann institutes to be organized in as many selected states, with a total capital of \$5,400,000, according to the Times. A large wholesale drug store is named as the purchaser. It was stated at Friedmann's hotel last night, that all plans had been made for the distribution of the serum, but the contract was not signed yet, and all details would be given by Friedmann Monday.

VIENNA, April 27.
Austria-Hungary will wait until Monday for some decisive action of the Powers regarding Scutari, according to a statement made in official quarters. Should the Powers fail by that time to agree on a united action, Austria-Hungary will proceed alone to vindicate her political and military prestige. It is reported that Germany has promised to support Austria, under all circumstances. Much significance is attached to the conference, which the foreign minister and war minister had with the Emperor yesterday.

LONDON, April 27.
Diplomatic circles here regard the withdrawal of Bulgarian troops from Saloniki as having great bearing on the Greco-Bulgarian differences regarding the possession of the town. Since the fall of Janina the Greeks have been concentrating their forces in the neighborhood of Saloniki. It is thought the Bulgarian commander at Seres became alarmed at the situation, and as a small Bulgarian force was left isolated, thought it wise to retire. Although the rupture is not believed imminent, developments are awaited with anxiety. The withdrawal of the troops is not regarded as indicating any change of the Bulgarian attitude on the subject of possession of Saloniki.

LONDON, April 27.
Hyde Park was again turned into a bedlam by the suffragettes and their opponents this afternoon. The women declining to recognize the police order that no suffragette meetings were to be held there appeared with a wagon and proceeded to address a small crowd. Youths commenced to gather and an attempt was made to drag the wagon to the Serpentine for the purpose of ducking the women. Mounted police intervened just

in time to save them and these women were escorted from the Park followed by a jeering crowd, who pelted them with turf and street refuse. After they entered the wagon, men supporters of their cause were treated similarly by the crowd who refused to allow any suffragette meeting, militant or otherwise.
The Perthshire cricket pavilion at Perth, together with a valuable collection of photos, records, relics, etc., was destroyed by fire to-day. Suffragettes are suspected although nothing of an incriminating nature was found.

Thrown into River and Drowned.
Bolton, Vt., April 21.—A negro youth of about 18 years old, who wandered into town Saturday, was hurled into the Winoek River, where he was drowned. It is charged, by four men, three of whom had accused him of stealing their dinner pails.
Three of the men, Henry McCabe, Jas. Sweeney and John Jennison, all of this town, were arrested last night and taken to the jail at Birmingham. Their companion, Henry Goodrich, also of Bolton, has disappeared, and is being sought. Jennison volunteered the circumstances of the negro's death, and the police say that his story was corroborated by the other prisoners. According to their version of the affair the boy was an unwilling participant in a game of "snap the whip" which crowned their efforts to extort a confession from him. When the whip "snapped" the victim shot into the stream and sank after a brief struggle.
