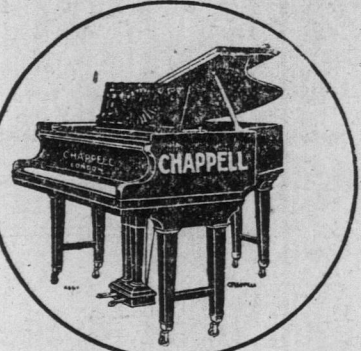


PIANO CLUB!
