A NEW POLICY.

DUBLIN, June 16.
The new policy of the British Government toward Ireland, soon to be instituted, involves the unconditional release of all Sinn Fein prisoners, who have not been convicted, it was learned on good authority here to-day.

SOVIET EXPLANATION.

TEHRAN, Persia, June 16.
The Russian Soviet Government, in reply to a note from Persia, declares that there is no question of an enterprise against Persian independence, but says it was necessary to protect Russian shipping on the Caspian Sea. The Soviet Government agrees to withdraw from Enzellan, Caspian, when Persian independence is guaranteed, and she is no longer under foreign influence.

STORM SWEEP.

CLEVELAND, Ohio, June 16.
One man was killed, another was reported dead and a dozen others had narrow escapes from death, and thousands of dollars worth of damage was done during a terrific electrical wind and rain storm of almost cloudburst proportions to-day. Nearly an inch of rain fell in six minutes and the wind attained a velocity of fifty-seven miles an hour, while the storm was at its height.


