The meeting was very harmonicus, every person present seemed to have the in-terest of the party and the welfare of the country at heart. The several members of the Conven-tion having spoken, each being confined to five minutes' time, a vote was taken, when the President declared Mr. Mo-Crancy had a majority. The vote was subsequently made unanimous. Mr. White then entered the room, and was received with enthusiastic demon-strations.
