## MONTREAL WILL ONE DAY HAVE 5,000,000 POPULATION

Very Detailed Guess by a Prominent Municipal Expert.

Montreal, May 18.—Mr. W. D. Light-hall, K. C., who has given a great deal of attention to municipal and political matters, read a paper this evening before the Presbyterian union in which he declared that in ten years' time Montreal would have a million people and that the English language would predominate, as the ever-increasing Jewish population were speaking English. He stated, however, that the Roman Catholic would be the predominating religion. He thought that Montreal would grow all over the island and possess one day five or six million souls.

## GRENFELL REPLIES TO ATTACK OF PEARY

Says Explorers Are No More Desirable Element Than Missionaries.

In a letter recently published in the Boston Transcript, Dr. Wilfred T. Grenfell, the Labrador missionary, thus replies to Commander Robert E. Peary's criticism of the missionaries of the Northland.

"I have noted numerous quotations of late from a lecture of Commander Peary and many criticisms of him for saying that he hopes that the Arctic Highlanders will never be Christianized. Dr. Nansen has said much the same thing. It is no great compliment even to the most primitive of mankind to consider them unable to survive the advent of true Christianity. There can be no question that Almighty God considers them able to survive it. The truth must therefore be that they can survive it. I myself do not think them able to survive what so many people confuse in their minds as being Christianity."

## Effect of Explorers.

"Intellectual submission to some particular doctrine, that is not Christianity—not as I see it illustrated in the life of the modern missionary. We are not all that we ought to be, but I cannot believe that we are more dangerous as a class than even the unselfish and generous class of explorers. My own experience is that the arrival of a strange vessel with a heterogeneous crew of sailors who make no pretense to Christianity whatever, is just as dangerous to a simple people with primitive ideas of morality as the arrival of a missionary of the 19th century type. Without 'warrior-pence' I am unable to say that I am not among those who object publicly to exploration expeditions, but I am among those who object to exploring going there themselves and then taking missionaries to task for going because they are missionaries."

"I have known Commander Peary for quite a number of years and his crew as well. I am among his most ardent admirers as a brave, capable gentleman and officer, a leader of men, and a man with a heart for sorrow and suffering, which even were there any suggestion of his wishing to deny it, has uniformly characterized his action in cases that I have known or heard of. And I should consider that the criterion which the Bible distinctly states will settle the questions as to the entrance into heaven settles also in the minds of the 20th century Christian the right of a man to the title Christian. It is distinctly stated we shall be accepted or rejected for ethical and not theological attainments."

## THE PHILIPPINES ARE STILL KEEN FOR INDEPENDENCE

Believe That Filipinos Are Able to Govern Themselves.

Washington, May 18.—"Our desire for independence remains unalterable," declared Speaker Osmena of the Philippine assembly in a cablegram to Delegate Quezon, who petitioned the House Saturday for immediate independence of the Philippines. The message was one of a number congratulating Mr. Quezon on his attitude. Speaker Osmena said that the Filipinos craved the advancement of the national cause by all possible means, that ten years of American administration showed that the Filipinos were capable of maintaining an independent government and that the justice of the American people would decide in favor of Filipino freedom.

## DUELLING NOT ALLOWED BY THE RUSSIAN DUMA

Two Enthusiastic Gentlemen Will Pay Penalty for Enthusiasm.

St. Petersburg, May 18.—Alexander Guchkoff, president of the Duma, and Count Tuvoroff, member, who settled a political quarrel on the field of honor, will as a result spend a part of the summer recess in imprisonment. A district court today found the legislators guilty of duelling and sentenced Guchkoff to four weeks confinement in the fortress, and the count to three weeks in the General Guard house. They will not appeal. Count Tuvoroff received a bullet in the shoulder during the encounter, while his adversary escaped injury. They fought at 25 paces on the outskirts of St. Petersburg on Nov. 20 last. The friends of the count say that he fired in the air.

Prizes for Clean Crops.

Local agricultural societies in Alberta, are giving \$100 prizes for the farmer who produces the best ten acres of clean seed grain.

According to W. C. McKillican, the district officer of the Dominion seed branch, these competitions will have a far reaching effect in improving the quality of grain produced in the province.

It is difficult to prevent the mixing of varieties of grain and the spread of weeds in a system of farming so extensive as acres. To combat this tendency, and to develop heavy yielding, early varieties, is the purpose of the agricultural societies in offering these handsome prizes. It is believed that by stimulating a spirit of friendly rivalry and by offering material reward to the successful, the general quality of the crops in a whole neighborhood may be affected.

The support of both the provincial and Dominion governments is behind these competitions. The former gives a money grant and the latter supplies expert judges to inspect the fields. The majority of the more progressive agricultural societies in the province have already organized competitions.
