NO PROSPERITY BROUGHT BY

HIGH TAXATION.

The truth is that to new manufacturing establishments have an called into existence under the Natio al Policy that can be regarded as highly prosperous. The clock factory at Whitby and the clock factory at Hamilton take no note of time. (Cheers and laughter.) They are dead. The fact of their existence was heralded abroad as an evidence of the impulse which high taxation could give to new industries. The "protectionist" journals had not done referring to these establishments when they had gone into liquidation. What is true of them is true of scores of others. Mr. Dunstan, of Halifax, unceasingly persisted in demanding changes in the sugar tariff to enable him and others to refine sugar at Halifax. The change was made by the present Ministry. Mr. Dunstan obtained the capital. The refinery was erected. The appliances were obtained. The work was begun. But the factory was soon closed. The capital has all been lost. What happened in this instance has happened in a hundred others; and so people have been impoverished by the capital that has been wasted, by the labor misdirected and by excessive taxation. Sir Leonard Tilley, before his retirement from the Government, said that the amount of capital invested in manufacturing enterprises during the preceding four years was \$4,600,000. a sum not much in excess of the amount taken by the Government from the pockets of the people in one year beyond the requirements of the public service. 
