Great Strike Averted

Cotton Operators and Operatives Agree to Arbitration.

British Syndicate Secures the Trade of the Sudan.

Lord Rosebery on Free Trade—Serious Shortage in the Austria-Hungary Grain Crop—Steamers in Trouble—Disastrous Collision.

DISASTROUS COLLISION. Berlin, Nov. 2.—An engine collided yesterday with a train at Eilenburg, on the Halle-Kottbus line, fifteen miles from Leipzig. Twenty-nine persons were injured, and of this number six persons may die as a result of the injuries they have received.

STOLEN. London, Nov. 2.—The store occupied by the Diamond Merchants' Alliance, on Piccadilly, London, was broken into by burglars between Saturday night and Monday morning, and diamonds, etc., to the value of \$75,000 were stolen. There is no clue to the party.

AUSTRIA'S SHORT CROP. Vienna, Nov. 2.—The crops of Austria-Hungary the present season are remarkably small. If the official estimates are fulfilled, the combined wheat production of Austria and Hungary will amount to little more than 130,000,000 bushels, or 60,000,000 bushels short of the crop of 1896. In 1896, which was estimated at about 130,000,000 bushels.

BIG STRIKE AVERTED. London, Nov. 2.—It was stated yesterday that the representatives of the employers and the delegates of the operatives had previously conferred, but failed to come to an agreement. Later in the day it was announced that the representatives of the two sides had come to an agreement to submit to arbitration the proposed Saturday night 5 per cent. a month hence the wages of the cotton operatives.

TRADE IN THE SUDAN. London, Nov. 2.—A dispatch to the Daily Mail from Khartoum, Sudan, says: "A British syndicate has obtained sole control of the trade in the Sudan, in exchange for the payment of an annuity to the Egyptian Government and the defrayal of the expenses of military occupation. It will reconstruct and work the railway from Khartoum to the Red Sea, to Berber on the Nile, the southernmost point reached by the Anglo-Egyptian expedition."
