

On the grand jury being called it was found that one of those summoned, Wm. S. Westland, a South London

painter, had died some months ago, and the sheriff was ordered to return the name of another able juror. Richard Brock, of Adelaide township, was accordingly chosen.

Judge Elliott, after instructing the grand jury in their duties, briefly re-viewed the cases which would come before the jurors; and explained the law in each case.

The first case on the docket, the charge of assault laid by Richard Mc-Garry, of West London, against W. H. Bartram, the judge characterized as one which should never have come before a jury. The charge against Wm. Davidson, that of stealing a quantity of stone, was also referred to as be-ing a rather trivial matter. The most rious case on the docket is the charge against the Indian, Peter Beaver, of criminally assaulting a 12-year-old girl, which charge, said the judge, may have to be changed to a more serious

Several city physicians, said the judge, would appear before the jurors, and address them on the advisability of establishing a sanitarium, and they would be expected to express their opinion on the matter. The judge closed with an expression of satisfac-tion at the conclusion of the South African war and the enthusiastic reception being tendered the Canadian soldiers in England.

The civil case of Vining vs. Taylor, a suit to recover \$200 damages for alleged wrongful cutting of timber, was first taken up before a jury.






