Va., Feb. 26.—Bat- tling Nelson, the champion lightweight pugilist, who is spending a few days in the mountains at Blue Sulphur, near here, prior to going into training at Philadelphia, was painfully bruised in stopping a runaway at that place yesterday. He rescued Mrs. Frank How- ard, with her two small children, from a perilous situation. Mrs. Howard had taken the children for a drive, and the horses, becoming frightened, bolted and ran. As the runaway neared Nel- son he grabbed the horse and succeed- ed in stopping it only after he had been dragged a considerable distance.
