NAMING A PLAY IMPORTANT MATTER

Thousands Sometimes Considered Before One Is Settied Upon.

Someone recently remarked that there were at least ten thousand manuscripts of plays in New York in search of a producer. To which another someone retorted that they must all be bad, for there never was a time when managers were so eager for good plays as today. And it may be added that now is the accepted time for the budding dramatist if he has a bud that will grow into a prosperous plant because of its merit.

Scarcely a manuscript reaches successful production without making a career for itself, as it passes through many hands and under the eyes and consideration of many readers in its way from author to broker, to manager, to player and to its goal, the

An instance of this which has the feature of novelty is shown in the story of the manuscript of "When All Has Been Said," written by Bayard Veiller, a New York newspaper man of repute and well-known to all theatrical folk. He had been impressed with the dramatic value of Jackson D Haag's "That Which Never Dies," and he made it into a play. Upon its com-pletion, he was at loss for a suitable title. He finally decided to give it the name of one of its characters, a 7-year-old boy named "William." With the manuscript in hand, he went to the office of a prominent play broker.
"I want you to take this play around to the manager you think will handle it best," said Mr. Veiller. "I have so many friends in the business that, if the play is any good, some will reproach me for not giving them first chance at it. I want to have nothing to do with its placing. And I want no intimation made that I wrote it My name does not appear in this manuscript. If the play is bad I do not want my friends to have any compunction about turning it down as hard is if it had been written by an absolute stranger."

A Poor Title.

The broker read the play, liked it and went to the offices of Liebler & Co. with it. There, despite the fact that it had been submitted without an author's name, its worth was at once recognized. The play was accepted under one condition-that its title should be changed. In the first place, the title "William" involuntarily called up a picture of a butler, and then

it suggested farce. The author was brought upon the scene, and a new title requested. The author suggested half a hundred, but none of them was found suitable. Then the managers and their staff of authors, press agents, and stage managers took up the problem, with no better luck. Finally, in their perplexity, Liebler & Co. offered \$100 for the best title for the play.

Five thousand letters of suggestion poured in. Those who took the trouble to write for a scenario received one and-were able to base their suggestions on something of substantial value. The vast majority, however, seemed to think that all that was necessary was title, whether it had any bearing on

the play or not. Therefore, thousands of such ludicuggestions as "A Colored Sol-"Hot Cross Buns," the Fort for Brave Jack Johnson," "A Tainted Venus," and "She Could Count Her Lovers on Her Finger Tips," were

Of the titles more worthy of consideration "Our Boy" and "William the Conqueror" seemed the favorites. The former was suggested no less than ninety times, and the latter over sixty. The young man sending in the winning title, "When All Has Been Said," had done so under the name of Howard Millward. He had had no hones of winning the hundred, and so had not used his own name. After notification had been sent to him to the effect that a check awaited him, an actor named Joseph Allenton presented himself at the Liebler offices, identified himself as the writer of the let ter, and received his check.


