### CANADA'S EXPORTS DECREASE, BUT HER IMPORTS INCREASE

Dominion's Expenditure On Imports During Fiscal Year More Than Treble Exports.

BIG DROP IN MARCH

Value of Year's Trade \$99, 378,297 Greater Than Previous Twelve Months.

OTTAWA, April 25 .- Although the total value of Canada's trade for the fiscal year ending March 31 last was Marshal Foch and General Degoutte, Deputies today gave evidence of what is March alone show a decided drop in the trade of the Dominion. The grand total of Canadian trade for March of the present year, as snown by figures issued from tre department of customs and inland revenue, was \$162,034,704. In March, 1920, this total was \$240,-716,374, a decline of \$78,681,670. Imports \$142,497,365.

The major part of the reduction is in the value of imports. In March, 1920, Canada imported goods to the value of \$142.497.385. hast month the total value of major was only \$92. total value of imports was only \$92,-566,829, a decrease of \$49,930,536. In March, 1920, domestic goods value of \$93,193,859 were exported from the Dominion, while in March, 1921, the value of domestic exports was only \$68,092,428, a decrease of \$25,040,431.
