A HEAVY YIELD.-Mr. Melbourne Morse, of Bridgetown, says that he produced last year on 114 rods of land 60 bus. corn in the ear; 31 bus. potatoes, 2 bus. beans; 240 bus. mangle warts; 55 bus. turnips; 140 heads of cabbage, as good as any raised in the County; 4 ox cart loads pumpkins; 1 ton corn fodder. This would give a return of \$112.60, at the market price.

The last issue of the Yarmouth Herald published its annual statement of Yarmouth shipping, showing a total of 252 vessels, meaning 141,331 tons, a decrease since Jan. 1st, 1880, of 3,023 tons. Fourteen vessels lost; 12 vessels sold; 10 vessels a fair equivalent for a building, 9, measuring 11,900 tons.
