Miss Smith, why do you not stay and see our Canadian winter?

"I would like very much to do so but duty calls me home. There is so much to be done in London, many little boys and girls to be rescued this winter. You can have no conception here, where you have room enough and to spare, of the over-crowding there, the thousands of children growing up the associates of these and vile characters in utter ignorance of God or virtue. We feel that if we can only get them entirely away from their old associates that there is every likelihood of their being trained to be useful men and women."

"Well if you only turn out all of them like Agnes we will have nothing to complain of for your bringing them here."

"We do not expect that. Some have turned out badly and given us great anxiety and trouble but we know this, that if we left them where they are they are cer-
