

CHEAP CARE —Four eggs, two sups of sugar, one cup butter, five cups flour, four teaspoors'ul king powder, two cups sweet mitk an flavouring to taste. First beat the butter and sugar together. Next beat the eggs to a light froth. Then add the mitk. Mis labing powder with flour before a iding other ingredients.

HERRING SALAD. - Soak for six hours three Hotland herring; cut in small pieces; cook and peel eight potatoes, and hop with two small cooked beets, two onions, one sour apple and four hard builed eggs. Mix with sauce of sweet oil, vinegar, pepper and mustard to taste. Add a tablespoonful of sour cresm; let stand over night.

TAPIOCA FRUIT PUDDING.—One half cupful of tapioca soaked over night in one quart of cold water. In the morning cover the bottom of a baking dish with any kind of fruit, either canned or fresh, sweeten the tapioca with one half cupful of sugar, add a little salt and nutmeg, pour over the fruit and bake one hour. Serve with sauce.

SILVER CARE.—Two teacupsful of powdered white augar, one cup of white outter, whites of six eggs beaten to a stiff froth, sufficient float to make a cake batter; add good baking powder to the flour if desired; flavour with essence of vanilla. First put the butter and sugar to a cream, hen add the other ingredients. Bake in a quick oven. quick oven.

POTATO SALAD -Cut a dozen of cold POTATO SALAD.—Cut a dozen of cold boiled potatoes into slices from a quarter to half an inch. Put these in a solad towl with four tablespoonsful of good vinegar, six ab'espoonsful of Lucca cream oil, one tablespoonful of chopped parsley, with pepper and salt to taste. Stir well together till all is thoroughly mixed, and set aside for three hours. three hours.

APPLE PUDDING.—Stir a cup of corn me.l into a quart of boning mik; then s.ir in a quart of sliced sweet appl s, a cup of molasses and a teaspoonful of salt; mix all agether well. We on ready to put into the iven add two quarts of milk, pour into a large pudding dish, and bake slowly till done; when cold, a clear, amber-colour jelly will be formed.

COCOANUT CREAM PUDDING.— Three tablespronsful of tapioca soaked over night, one quart boiling milk, one small cup of sugar and the yoke of four eggs. Boil ten minutes, add three tablespronsful of cocoanut and boil five minutes longer. Beat the whites to a stiff froth, stir in a little sugar, and spread on top. Sprinkle with cocoanut and br. wn. Serve cold.

CLARET JELLY. - fool an ounce of gelatine in half a pint of cold water until it is dissolved. APPLE MARMAIADE. - Take nice, sound APPLE MARMAI ADE.—Take nice, sound rusest apples, pare and core, cut in small pieces, and to every pound of fruit add one pound of sugar, put the sugar to boil, with just enough water to dissolve it, into a preserving kettle, add one large lemon to every four pounds of fruit, boil all together until the syrup gets thick, then add the apple and boil until it looks clear. 
