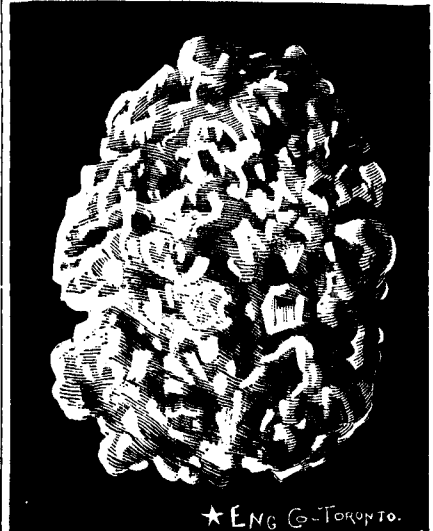

OPERATION.

This cut is a true representation of a bone taken from the knee joint of Mr. Seacord, of Baysville, Muskoka territory.
