Audrey McLaughlin a déclaré que l'accord de libre-échange pourrait bien forcer le Canada à détourner une partie de son eau potable vers les États-Unis et le Mexique. Selon M^{me} McLaughlin, le Canada a abandonné tout contrôle sur ses ressources d'eau potable en vertu de l'ALE et ce problème demeure aussi critique avec l'ALENA. En réponse à cette affirmation, M. Gordon Ritchie a dit que l'exportation d'eau est spécifiquement exclue de ces accords.

The Council of Canadians, following the lead of the Action Canada Network, is urging people not to support the National Party but to vote strategically for those against the NAFTA and FTA to ensure a minority Liberal government with the NDP holding the balance of power.
