Also,—Ordinances of the Yukon Territory passed by the Yukon Council in the year 1927.

He also laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Report of the Commissioner of Patents for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1927.

He also laid before the House,—A detailed statement of all bonds or securities registered in the Department of the Secretary of State of Canada, since last return, submitted to the Parliament of Canada under section 32 of chapter 19, of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906.

Mr. King (Kootenay East), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Report of the Department of Health for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1927.

He also laid before the House,—Statement of Receipts and Expenditures for Sick and Distressed Mariners for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1927.
