TRADING CARDS

Ms. Dawn Black (New Westminster—Burnaby): The Minister of National Revenue said he would stop the importation of mass murderer trading cards which outline the grisly actions of over 100 serial killers. He has failed.

These cards are currently being sold to children and adults in stores across Canada. They tell children, for example, how one man raped and killed four women, removed portions of their corpses as trophies, dressed their bodies in underclothes from his collection and photographed them.

Our obscenity laws are out of date. I call on the Minister of Justice to amend the Criminal Code along the lines of the Supreme Court Butler decision to deal with the presence in Canada of violent and sexually violent materials, not just their importation.

Consensual sex itself is not obscene, but violence, murder, degradation and dehumanization is, with or without sex.

What will the government do about the violent images that have become an ordinary part of our children's lives?
