

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (161), intituled: "An Act to provide for Family Allowances," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time, and—  
With leave of the Senate, it was—

Ordered, That it be placed on the Orders of the Day for a second reading to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Honourable Senator King moved that the Bill (168), intituled: "An Act for the Support of the Prices of Agricultural Products during the transition from War to Peace," be now read a second time.

After debate,

The said Bill was read the second time.

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was then read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (170), intituled: "An Act to provide for the Insurance of Veterans by the Dominion of Canada," was read the second time, and—

Referred to the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce.

The Senate adjourned.
