Dear Mr. Currie,

Montreal is the one large city of Eastern Canada that has not yet been reached in the interests of the Endowment for the Grenfell Association. We have planned if possible to employ May 1st to 7th in Montreal, when Dr. Grenfell will accompany us to address meetings and otherwise aid the Montreal Committee to accomplish Montreal's share of this fund.

In beginning to form the Montreal Committee we are very eager to get started on the right foot, and insure if possible a committee of large influence to facilitate the effort.

I recall that on the occasion of the Canadian Club dinner in Boston you expressed to Dr. Grenfell your interest in this enterprise, and I am going to ask if you would not be willing to be responsible for issuing a call to a select group for a meeting which I will attend any time in early February which would be convenient to the group called, and thus give me an opportunity to lay before those present the claims of the Grenfell work and the plan of raising this Endowment, and at that time to endeavor to enlist their cooperation in forming such Committee for the May 1st to May 7th effort.

In the event for any reason your own engagements preclude your taking the responsibility of calling such a meeting, can you not request Dean Adams or some other man of influence to cooperate with us in getting such a gathering of representative people at a preliminary meeting.
