The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.
It was decided to amend the qualification for awards for Periodic Sports by adding, after the words "75\% of the periods" the words "(exclusive of overtime periods)".

It was decided to raise the Soccer and English Rugby clubs to the Minor Sport category, commencing in the Session 1926-27.

It was decided to amend CATEGORIES, sub-sec. $(\mathrm{h})$ to read "notwithstanding the above regulations the Third Grade colours will be granted to regular members of representative intercollegiate period type or individual type first teams, and numerals will be granted to regular members of Univergity period type and individual type not qualifying as above in authorized meots.

It was decided that in consideration of the fact that D.C. MoDiarmid dislocated his ankle during the Intercollegiate Track Meet, where he had an excellent chance of obtaining second place in the High Jump, and in consideration of the fact that this is his last year at college, that he be granted a Second Grade colour.

In view of the fact that Desmond Walsh plajed in all the periods of two of the Intercollegiate games as weli as all the periods of the pre-season exhibition gemes, and that he undoubtediy would have continued to hold his place on the first team if he had not received an injury which prevented him from further participation, it was decided to grant him the First Grade Colour.

Awards Were granted in accordance wi th the lists submitted to the Athletic Boara, there being a total of 45 First Grade, 73 Second and 67 Third Grade Colours.

A grant of $\$ 15.00$ was made toward a Championship Dinner for
the Water Polo team.
It was decidod to sell the tickets for the Re-union game on October 9 th, 1926 at $\$ 2.00$ each and to pay the Re-union Committee 45 cents on each reserved seat sold for this game.
