ter any part of the arms or equipments which may Personsselling or be delivered to him out of Her Majesty's stores, or equipments, to or who shall destroy the same, and every person viction, and on refusing to pay, who shall buy or by barter obtain such arms or mitted. equipments, shall severally and respectively forfeit and pay the sum of five pounds for every offence, on conviction thereof by the oath of any one credible witness, before two Justices of the Peace, residing within the County where the same has been committed; and in case the person so selling any part of his arms or equipments as aforesaid, or the person obtaining the same in manner aforesaid, being thereof convicted as aforesaid, shall refuse or neglect to pay the said sum of five pounds, it shall and may be lawful for the said Justices, by a warrant under their hands and seals, to commit such person to the gaol of the County or District in which the offence shall be committed, for any space of time not exceeding two months: Provided always that it shall and may be lawful for the said Justices Offenders may be to discharge the person so offending any time before imprisonment by the expiration of the said two months, when the person so convicted, as aforesaid, shall tender to the said Justices the penalty inflicted by this Act.

43. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any person shall wilfully swear Wilful false ewearing, perfalsely in any proceeding or matter with respect jury. to which he shall have been sworn, under and according to the provisions of this Act, every such person, on being lawfully convicted thereof, shall be deemed guilty of wilful and corrupt perjury, and shall suffer the like punishment as by law may now be inflicted on persons convicted of wilful and corrupt perjury.
