apparently not less than twenty yards in length. Regir.ald observed also several smaller lodges immediately adjoining that of the chief, on one side, and on the other a circular tent of wax-clotl., or painted canvass, evidently procured from white men, as it was of excellent texture, and its door, or aperture, protected by double folds of the same material.

Whilst he was still looking at this comparatively civilized dwelling, with some curiosity to know by whom it might be tenanted, the folds of the opening were pushed aside, and an elderly man appeared, who, after contemplating for a moment the newly-arrived group, came forward to offer them a friendly salutation. He was apparently between fifty and sixty; but his years were not easily guessed, for his snow-white hair might seem to have numbered seventy winters; while from the uprightness of his carriage, and the elasticity of his step, he seemed scarcely past the vigour of In figure he was tall and slight; his middle life. countenance, though tanned by long exposure to the sun, was strikingly attractive, and his mild blue eye beamed with an expression of benevoleuce not to be mistaken. His dress was a black frock of serge, fastened at the waist by a girdle of the same colour, from which was suspended
