MINUTES of the Proceedings of a Court Martial affembled and held on board His Majefly's Ship Belleille, in Halifax Harbour, Nova-Scotia, on Wednefday, 26th August, 1807, so try JENKIN RATFORD, of his Majefly's Ship Halifax, for Mutiny, Defertion, and Contempt, as fet forth in a Letter from her Commander, The Right Honourable Lord JAMES TOWNSHEND.

PRESENT,

The Hon. Sir ALEXANDER COCHRANE, K. B. Rear Admiral of the White, and Second Officer in the Command at Halifax, Prefident.

CAPTAINS,

FRANCIS PICKMORE, WILLIAM CHARLES FAHIE, EDWARD HAWKER, JOHN ERSKINE DOUGLAS, PHILIP BEAVER, NATHANIEL DAY COCHRANE,

Being all the Captains of the rank of Post at this place.

On the Court affembling, at half paft ten o'clock, the prifoner being brought forward, the evidence called over, and audience admitted, read the Order addreffed to the Prefident from the Honourable GEORGE CRANFIELD BERKELEY, Vice Admiral of the White, and Commander in Chief at Halifax, Nova-Scotia, &c. dated the 25th of August, and the Prefident's Order to the Judge Advocate to officiate as fuch, when the Members, and Judge Advocate were feverally fworn, agreeable to Act of Parliament; and the following letter, containing the charges against the prifoner, read:
