URGES LEGISLATION RE FOREIGN VOTERS Says Declaration of Intention to Become Citizens Is Necessary.

Discussing present day problems at a smoker under the auspices of Ward 4 Riding's Association, in Macbean's Hall last night, the Hon. G. Howard Ferguson, minister of lands, forests and mines of Ontario, said that while it was necessary to look overseas for capital and population to assist in the development of Canada's natural resources, all future immigrants should prove by declaration their sympathy and loyalty to British institutions.

At present there was little foreign population enjoying franchise rights, and it was proposed to broaden the scope of the Ontario government office in London, England, hitherto used in connection with the supply of labor and domestic help.

London, March 26.—The committee appointed by the industrial conference summoned by Premier Lloyd George in February last to consider the causes of industrial peace in the future, has completed its report.

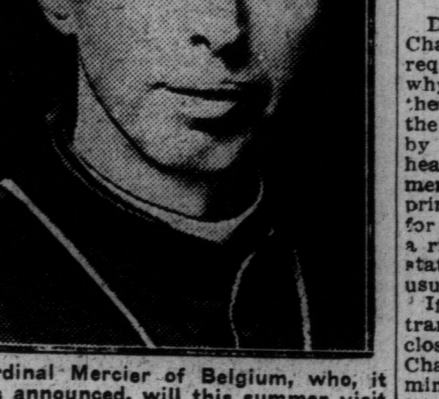
