POLITICS AT EGLINTON.

Henry Reception of Mr. St. John, the Conservative Candidate—Vicious Speeches—Enthusiastic Meeting.

One of the series of meetings in the interests of Mr. J. W. St. John was held last night at the Eglington Town Hall. The hall was crowded and both candidates spoke.
