Sold Whiskey to Deluded Indians and Starvation is Threatened. Port Townsend, Wash., Sept. 25 .- Ac ording to reports from Nome, brought by section are threatened with starvation.

During the past few months about 300 natives have visited Nome, bringing furs to trade for supplies. As soon as their goods were disposed of, however, whiskey peddlers got among them, and they changed the starvation of the prisoner in the brie County Jall at noon.
