

FROM DEATH'S DOOR

AN OTTAWA MAN'S WONDERFULLY NARROW ESCAPE.

Ottawa, Ont., Sept. 26.—(Special).—At 300 Gilmore St., this city, there resides a man who has been nearer the hour and article of death than anyone who has been privileged to live and tell the story.

He is Mr. George H. Kent, a printer in the employ of the Bank Note Company of Wellington St.

Some seven or eight years ago Mr. Kent was seized with bright's disease which gradually grew worse till he had to quit work and was confined to his bed, where he remained for some months.

THE CHICAGO OF CANADA

Englishman Says Toronto Can Be Made Centre of Large Cattle and Meat Trade.

A GREAT MARKET IN ENGLAND

Has Been Developed By The United States, and Canadians Can Secure It.

The World has another letter this morning from Mr. Andrew Webb, the English cattle man who has been criticizing what he calls the wasteful methods of Canadian cattle slaughterers.

He says that the United States have developed in England a big meat trade, which they will not be able to continue to supply, and that here is the chance for the Canadians to step in.

And in order to take advantage to an opening already made for them. And in order to take advantage of this opportunity the trade must be centralized in Toronto. Mr. Webb's letter reads:

Editor World: I read with great interest the 26th John Dwyer's discussion on the centralization of the markets in Toronto, whereby the great waste of by-products could be utilized and put on the best markets, and by so doing the value of the cattle would rise considerably. That this is a very desirable thing, I do not dispute, and as he does not feel the loss, no doubt makes him careless as to whether there is a remedy forthcoming for the farmer and the stock raiser. They are consequently forced to send their cattle on to markets where they are sold for the value of their carcasses, hides and fat.

The remainder of the carcasses is sold as next to valueless, and, therefore, do not figure in what is the result? When they get their returns for the cattle, they are very dissatisfied, and in a good many cases give up cattle raising altogether. Take for instance the price of cattle sold at Buffalo and Chicago this week at \$8.50 to \$8.75 and \$8.75 to \$9.00 respectively. In Toronto on the same date, Tuesday, 23 inst., a difference of about \$2.05 per 100 lbs. a choice steer will bring \$10.00, and a medium one a loss of \$2.65 on 700 lbs. would mean a deficiency of less to the farmer in the amount of his year's crop. By so doing, you are able without much expenditure to collect all by-products and bring all that has been classed as waste to its full value, which, when you once get on a good market, will again bring you in the monetary returns.

Again by combining the butchers could erect a good olefactory by which they could render their fat into the oleo, which has an unlimited sale on the continent and England, and being made into oleomargarine and disposed of as a cheap substitute for butter. At Deptford, England, the cattle dealers combined and erected an oleo works, where, according to the weight of fat they send in to the works he receives a cent for every three months. Before this factory was erected, the price of fat ruled 5 cents per lb to 5 1/4 cents in Deptford. To-day the price of fat is 7 1/2 cents per lb, or as near as possible two cents per lb. more than when they allowed the price to be handled their fat. A good choice steer would yield 50 lbs. of fat, and a rise of two cents per lb. would put him a dollar a head more on the value of the animal.
