

CHURCH ECONOMIZES BY DISPENSING WITH CONGREGATIONAL TEA

King Street Presbyterians Out To Conserve Resources.

ANNUAL MEETINGS HELD

Membership of Churches Increases—Activity in Young People's Societies.

In line with the consistent efforts of the congregation of King Street Presbyterian Church to conserve resources wherever possible for war service, the congregational tea was dispensed with on Wednesday evening as a feature of the annual congregational meeting.

The Red Cross auxiliary, of which Mrs. W. R. McIntosh is president, reported a year of much activity and a large amount of time and money devoted to various phases of war work. The church was also a member of the Red Cross auxiliary, including those of two nurses. The thanks of the church were expressed to George C. Glennie for his generous contribution of \$100 to the Red Cross auxiliary.

The steady growth of King Street Church was evidenced by the fact that 55 new members were added in the past twelve months, an increase of 10 per cent. The church is now a total of 502 now on the roll. The mission giving showed an increase of \$150 and the general giving also showed a small increase.

Sunday school work is given a place of much prominence in the activities of the King Street Church because of the recognition that the school is the church of the future. The Sunday school has achieved the dignity of an annual meeting of its own, which was held some days ago. Ross Mackay, reporting on behalf of the school secretary, Mr. Hindmarsh, stated that \$200 had been raised for all purposes by the school alone which has nine organized classes with a total membership of more than 80. In the young people's department, in addition to the primary and junior school, and a progressive boys' club known as the "Live Wires."

C. E. Perry presided over the meeting. L. Sumner acting as secretary. The new members elected to the board of managers are: W. R. McIntosh, A. Turnbull, Ralph Skinner, G. C. Perry, G. S. Forsythe and R. S. Morrison were re-elected. Alderman J. J. MacKay and R. J. Goodham are the new members of the missions board. R. J. Blake was chosen auditor for the coming year.

A vote of thanks was tendered R. S. Morrison for his services in connection with the finances of the church.

HERE'S AN OPPORTUNITY FOR RETURNED SOLDIERS

Many May Join 7th Guard Details Until They Find Better Jobs.

Fifty men are required at once by the 7th Fusiliers Guard Details. Capt. Watt, O.C. the 7th Guard, has been instructed to obtain that many men as soon as possible. Special arrangements have been made to utilize returned soldiers, who have been discharged, on the ground that a number of them are not otherwise employed and those wishing to join the 7th are to be permitted to do so with the understanding that as soon as they secure civilian employment they are to be given their discharge from the 7th. Those incapable of doing guard duty will be given other light employment around the quarters.

It is expected that many returned men will take advantage of the opportunity to secure an income, while awaiting the chance of obtaining profitable civilian employment. Men in the guard are paid the usual \$1.10 per day with an additional 45 cents per day subsistence allowance in the case of married men.

"ALL RIGHT, I DON'T CARE", SAYS MIKE TANCREADE WHEN TOLD OF HIS ESCAPE FROM THE GALLOWS

Then Turns Over and Resumes His Disturbed Slumbers— Jail Officials Glad Reprieve Came, All Believing Him Not Accountable For Actions.

"All right, I don't care," said Mike Tancreade in Italian, when informed by a fellow countryman in his native tongue, that the sentence of death passed on him at the last fall assizes, had been commuted to life imprisonment by the department of justice.

When the dispatch announcing the department's decision was received in the city last evening, Father Brennan, who has been Tancreade's spiritual adviser since he has been under sentence of death, was communicated with by telephone.

Factor in Brennan in turn phoned Governor Carter at 9:30 o'clock at his residence and asked permission to send one of Tancreade's fellow countrymen over to the jail to break the news to him.

Breaking the News. The latest event, Tancreade's companion went with all haste to the county jail to communicate the glad tidings to the prisoner, whose mind has grown gradually weaker since the last sentence was passed in October last by Mr. Justice Lennox.

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
