



# PEOPLE OF NOTE



Hon. Redfield Proctor, United States senator from Vermont since 1891 whose present term will expire in 1911, was born of distinguished ancestry in Proctorsville, Vt., on June 1st, 1831. He graduated from Dartmouth College in 1851 and later from the Albany Law College. He practised law in the Vermont courts and was very successful. He invested in quarry mines in his state and accumulated a large fortune. During the Civil war, Senator Proctor served from lieutenant to colonel in a Vermont Regiment. He went to Cuba as a United States senator in 1898, shortly before the outbreak of the Spanish-American war, and on his return his speeches against the terrible regime kept up by the Spanish made him very popular.
