



Germans Kick Them For Slightest

Germans Kick Them For Slightest

Offence — Food is Poor and
Scarce—Hatred of All British

Rotterdam, Feb. 20—The British exchanged prisoners on their arrival in Holland were most anxious to know how the German prisoners were being treated in England, as they had been told by their guards that captured Germans were treated abominably. To this they attributed the rough system of the prisoners' camp in Germany.

"We acte treated all right at the hospital," says a non-commissioned officer who lost his left hand, "especially by the nurses, but our fellows in camp have had an awful time. For the slightest complaint they were kicked and for more senous breaches of discipline they were tect to a post for hours. The food consisted chiefly of beans, of poor quality and small in quantity. Our clothes were nothing but rags, and, when the men protested, they were told Your friends in England have cut off the food supply."

A London Times' correspondent who interviewed the returning prisoners at Oldenzaal, says they declared that hat-

A London Times' correspondent who in the interviewed the returning prisoners at Oldenzaal, says they declared that hattred of the British was most noticeable among those Germans who did not know them. German soldiers who had been at the front, were by no means so hostile as those who had not. At Wurzburg there was, until he was transferred else ahere, a general who, whenever he inspected the British officers, grew very angry, getting red and always spluctering out: 'You are ugly and miserable!' Quite different treatment was accorded to the French officers and men.
