MANITOBA APPROVES PUBLIC UTILITY BD.

Regarded as Start in Direction
of Local Government
System

WINNIPEG, Man., March 27.—As being a start in the direction of having a local government board in Manitoba,

the principle of which was heartily endorsed, representatives of opposition groups in the Legislature last night placed themselves on record as approving of the government's bill for creating a municipal and public utility board. They made it clear, however, that they are not satisfied with some of the 184 clauses of the measure, which is one of the longest ever presented to the House, and would make a strenuous fight to get amendment effected in committee.

Under the legislation a board of three, a chairman and two part time members will be created to control the affairs of municipalities and keep them financially sound and to administer the public utility act, under which control is exercised over sale of company shares.

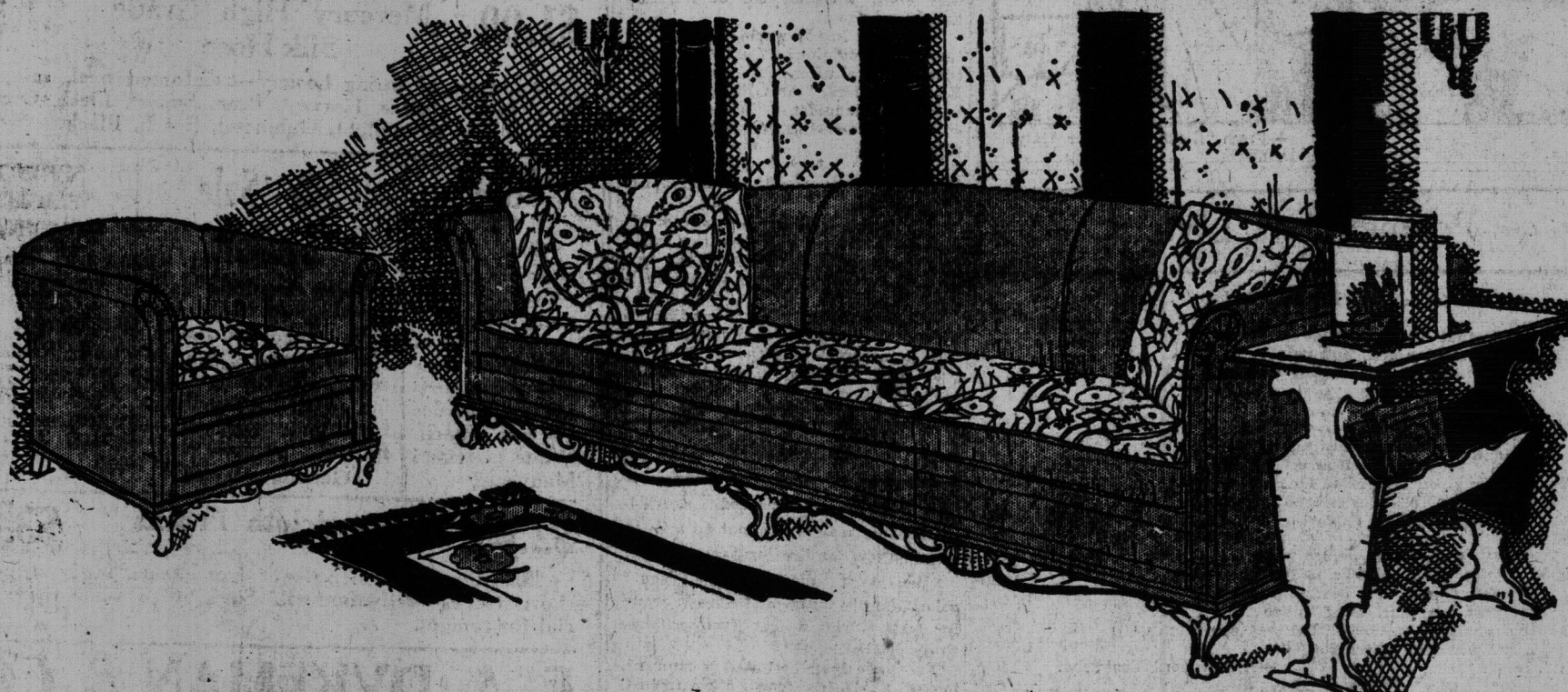

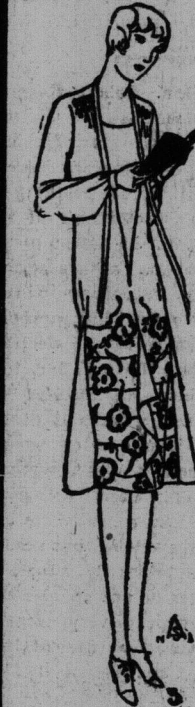
