MONTREAL, Nov. 5-J. E. Marle, who was re-elected in the contituency of Bagot, Que., in the re-tent federal elections, died here this afternoon at the Hotel Dieu Hospital. Mr. Marcile was a Liberal in poli-

teux.

His death marks the passing of one of the doyens of the House of Commons. In point of continuous service he ranked second only to Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux, who was first elected in 1896, and who has sat continuously since then.
