

GETS \$1,500 IN BREACH CASE

Judge Would Like to Have
Seen Verdict for a Larger
Sum.

Brockville, Ont., March 10.—After four and a half hours of deliberation the jury in a \$3,000 breach of promise action brought by Miss Annie Elizabeth Alstrop, of Montreal, against Alex. Argue of Lyndhurst, a drover, yesterday brought in a verdict in favor of the plaintiff, giving her \$1,500 damages. Mr. Justice Arde complimented the jury upon their verdict, which had coincided with his own conclusions, and said he had hoped the circumstances might warrant larger damages being granted.

F. E. Marvin.

After a lingering illness of several weeks' duration, Frederick E. Marvin, a highly respected citizen, died last evening at his late residence, 182 Douglas avenue. The late Mr. Marvin was born in Keesville, New York, in 1849 and came to this city in 1894. He was first connected with the James Pender Company and later was one of the promoters of the Maritime Mail Company, Limited. After severing his connection with this latter concern, the late Mr. Marvin became president and general manager of the Canada Mail and Wire Company, Limited, whose plant in West St. John manufactures horseshoe nails. He was a family man in every sense of the word and took a deep interest in the affairs

of his church, the Main street Baptist. His passing will be mourned by all who knew him. He is survived by his wife, one son, H. A. Marvin, manager of the Maritime Mail Company, Limited, and one daughter, Mrs. A. W. Hamilton, Chicago (Ill.).

Mr. Marvin also leaves two sisters, Mrs. William Stothard of Burlington, Vt., and Mrs. William A. Alexander of Chicago. He was a member of the Independent Order of Foresters and a member of the board of directors of Cedar Hill cemetery.

John Cairns.

The friends of John Cairns will regret to learn of his death, which occurred suddenly yesterday afternoon at Prince of Wales. He was on his way from the residence of his brother to catch the train for this city to visit his son when his death occurred. He was near his brother's residence when he fell to the ground and friends at once hastened to his aid, but their efforts were in vain. Mr. Cairns, who was seventy-five years of age, was a lifelong resident of Prince of Wales. He is survived by one son, John, of West St. John; one daughter, Mrs. George E. Crowe, of Los Angeles, and one brother, William, of Prince of Wales.

DECEYED FROM BRIDE AND SHOT IN BACK

Young Man Dying After Attack in Street by Two Gunmen, Who Fled.

Santi Randazzo, twenty-six years old, of New York, was removed, dying, to Bellevue Hospital after he had been shot in the back and right side by two men who decoyed him to the street from the apartment of his father-in-law, Max Bertman, on the third floor of 222 East Thirteenth street.

Randazzo, with his bride of a few months, was visiting the Bertman family when a little girl came to the door and said neighbors in the tenement in which the Randazzos lived had sent her to tell them that burglars were at work in their apartment.

Randazzo hurried to the street, but as he started toward First avenue two young men wearing caps stepped out of a doorway with pistols in their hands. Witnesses later told the police that Randazzo appeared to recognize them and darted across the street to the hallway of the tenement at 231 East Thirteenth street.

The two men followed him, and as he started up the stairs toward the second floor fired a dozen shots at him. They ran back to the street and disappeared in a tenement half way down the block. Detectives said they believed the shooting was the outcome of a neighborhood feud.
