

DISCIPLES OF MADAM DEFARGE

German "Reds" Prepare List to Suffer Death at Revolution—Demonstration That They "Mean Business."

Berlin, Dec. 29.—(Associated Press Correspondence)—German radical disciples of what is called here "Red Russian terrorism," say they are planning to overturn the present German government and establish a proletarian dictatorship, openly announce that they have drawn up lists of "capitalists and undesirable" who shall be killed when the revolution begins.

One of these men, a hotel waiter, who calls himself a "precinct leader," complained the other day that his list included "nearly everybody around here" who has influence, property or money. He said, a "superior" came to him one day and read a list of names, and announced these were to be the "precinct leader's" quota when the killing began. The waiter declared he acknowledged "orders" but thought the programme was being carried too far.

"As leader in this precinct I am expected to kill a lot of folks when the revolution gets under way," he said. "My list is certainly big enough. What do you think about that?"

Apparently his opinion of his orders was very low, but when asked if he would carry them out if opportunity offered he merely laughed.

To Kill Many People.

Radicals of the most pronounced tendencies toward revolution and destruction may be encountered everywhere. They appear quite proud of the fact that Germany today is "a land of the freest speech on earth," and sometimes ask what would happen to men who preached their doctrine in the United States. Frequently they are students, carrying along with their textbooks all sorts of radical literature. They discuss their "plans" with great liberty. One of them, a small, mild mannered person, of distinctly Slavic type, said it would be necessary to kill many people during the next revolution in order to impress upon the bourgeoisie that they "meant business."

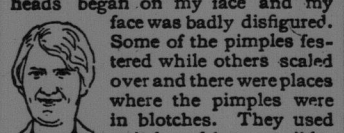
AUTOMOBILE TOO DANGEROUS FOR NOTED FRENCH ACE

Paris, Dec. 29.—(A. P. by Mail).—Charles Nungesser, the French "ace," who ranked second to Fonck as a successful military aviator during the war and who has been prominent at aerial meetings since the armistice, has decided to give up driving his automobile, saying it is too dangerous and expensive.

Nungesser was racing through Nedilly recently when he knocked down and killed a cyclist, as a result of which the court ordered him to pay the widow of his victim 30,000 francs for damages. "I think I'll stick to my airplane hereafter," he told the judge. "If anything is there I'll be the only one to suffer."

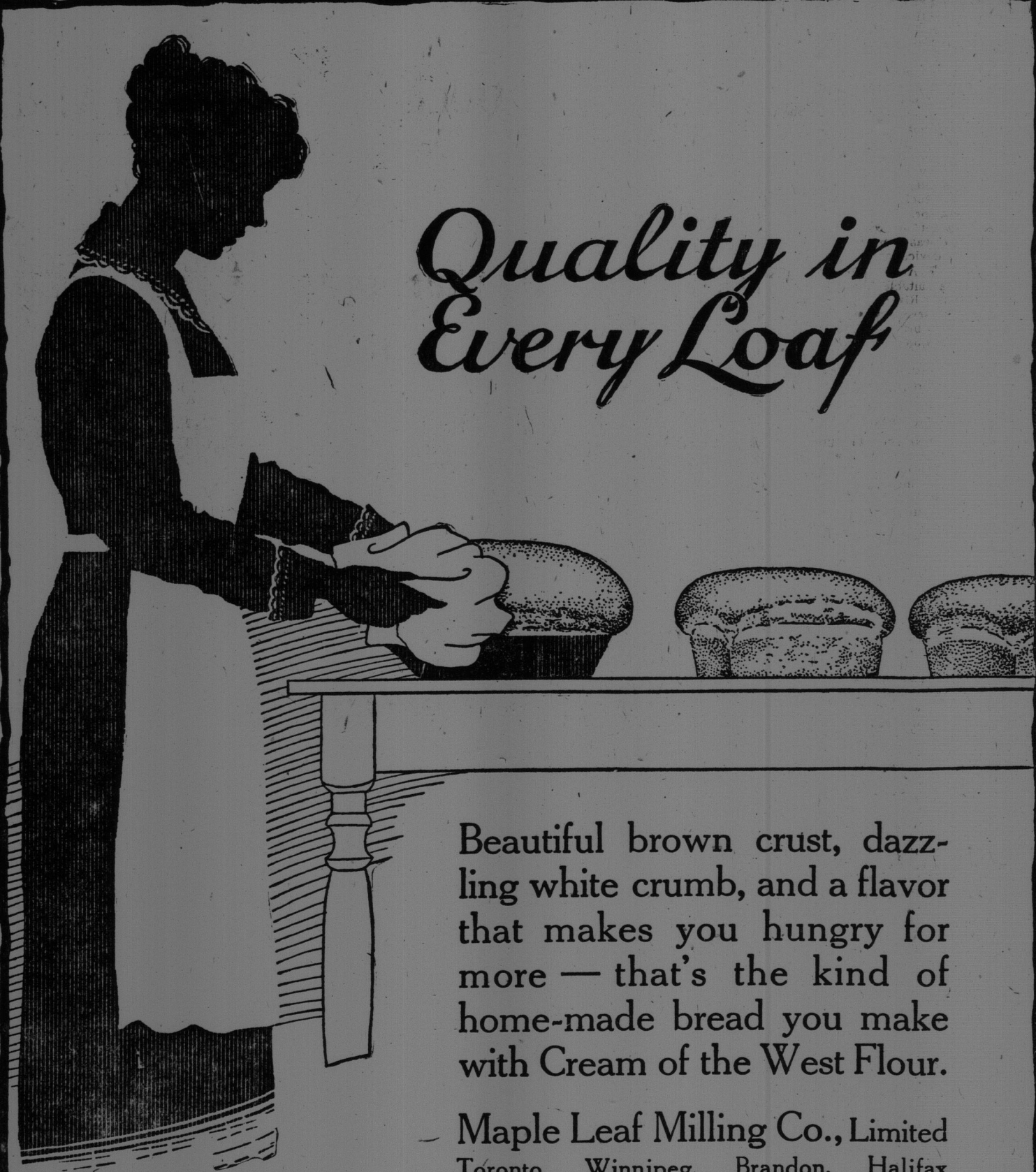
