PUBLIC NOTICE

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given by the City of St. John, N. B., that a meeting of the Common Council thereof held on the twenty-eighth day of April, A.D. 1913, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolved that the paving of that portion of Garden street from Hazen street to Coburg street is necessary and that the public interest in said paving should be done; and further:

Resolved that the Common Clerk publish a notice of the passing of this resolution and also an estimate of approximate cost per lineal foot of such paving as required under Section 1, Sub-section (b) of the Act of Assembly 7 Edward 7, create 27, Intituled "An Act relating to the paving of Streets in the City of Saint John."

And in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 (b) of the Act 7 Edward 7, Chapter 87, notice is also hereby given that it is estimated that the approximate cost per lineal foot of such paving is \$10.00, and that the owners of the frontage on said street, provided with a sidewalk, shall be liable for the cost of such paving.

And notice is also hereby given that after publication of this notice as required by the said Act the City may proceed to perform the work of paving the street (or portion of street) mentioned in this notice within one month after such publication of this notice.

And notice is also hereby given that the cost of such paving shall be apportioned to the owners of the frontage on said street, provided with a sidewalk, in proportion to the frontage of each owner on said street.
