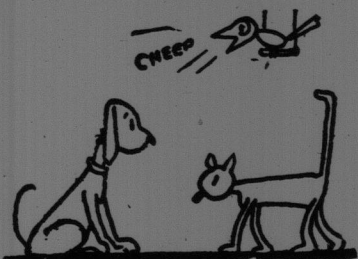


Social Notes Of Interest

Juice 1 lemon, 1 cup spinach, 1 hard-boiled egg, 4 ounces fillet of sole, 2 tablespoons cauliflower with ½ cup tomato puree and 1 teaspoon grated cheese, 6 radishes, ½ head lettuce, 1 cup fruit salad, 1 shredded wheat biscuit, 1 slice gluten bread, 1 gluten roll, 1 pint skimmed milk.
Total calories, 1018. Protein, 182; fat, 214; carbohydrate, 620. Iron, 0.0199 gram.

The cauliflower is boiled and then put in ramkins with the tomato and cheese.
