The year now under review has been the most prosperous in the history of the Schools under your charge, as respects both the number of pupils in attendance, and, since the erection of the large School Houses in 1854, the cost, per pupil, of their instruction, whether calculated on the basis of monthly registration or on that of daily average attendance.
