The New Brunswick Electric Power Commission.

TENDERS will be received by the above named Commission up to noon 21st day of September, A. D. 1920, for the following work:

(1) The construction of an earth dam across the East Branch of the Musquash River, including spillway, intake, bypass, etc., and the grading of a bed to carry a penstock from the dam to the power house.

(2) The construction of an earth dam across the West Branch of the Musquash River, including the items named above, together with the construction of a canal and the grading for the penstock from the dam to the power house above mentioned.

(3) The construction of an earth dam across the Shogomoc River, including items named above, together with the construction of a canal and the grading for the penstock from the dam to the power house.

Mode of Voting and Marking Ballot

The voter, on receiving the ballot paper, shall forthwith proceed into one of the polling compartments and there mark his ballot paper by making a cross with a black lead pencil within the white space containing the name of the candidate or of each of the candidates for whom he intends to vote. He shall then fold the ballot paper as directed so that the initials and official stamp on the back of it and the number on the counterfoil can be seen without opening it, and hand the paper to the deputy returning officer, who shall, without unfolding it, ascertain by examination of the initials, official stamp and number appearing thereon that it is the same paper as that delivered to the voter and if the same he shall forthwith, in full view of the voter and all others present, remove and destroy the counterfoil and deposit the ballot in the ballot box.
