## FREDERICTON.

Fredericton, N. B., Sept. 30.—(Special)—W. O. Raymond has passed a good examination at the Montreal Diocesan Theological College for one of the scholarships offered to college graduates. The result of the examination as posted on the notice board reads, "The educational council warmly recommends W. O. Raymond, B. A., for a scholarship of \$200 per annum, tenable for two years. His answering was remarkably good."

Mr. Raymond's degree at the U. N. B. has given him fourth place among 30 men. He will take Hebrew at McGill and his other lectures at the Diocesan College. He is a son of Rev. W. O. Raymond, of St. John, graduated with honors at the U. N. B. last year, and is studying for the ministry of the Church of England.
