In order to secure soundness and preservation, it is indispensably necessary that the fruit should be gathered by hand. For winter fruit the gathering is delayed as long as possible, avoiding severe frosts, and the nost successful practice with our extensive orchardists is to place the good fruit directorchardists is to place the good fruit directly, in a careful manner, in new, tight flour barrels, as soon as gathered from the tree.—
These barrels should be gently shaken while filling, and the head closely pressed in; they are then placed in a cool, shady exposure under a shed open to the air, or on the north side of a building, protected by a covering of boards over the top, where they remain for loads over the top, where they remain for controlled to promptly.
