How to Wear - a Successful Warfare

As a Matter of Time

First and foremost among those against

whom the housekeeper cherishes the

most deadly foe is the bedbug. It is a

fiction that should have been exploded

long ago that the presence of these crea-

tures is, under all circumstances, a proof

of lack of cleanliness. In cold climates

and in new houses they usually give little

trouble, but in warmer temperatures and

especially in old buildings, constant

vigilance is required. Sunning a bed has

no effect upon the pests, except, perhaps,

a pleasurable one, for they delight in

warmth. Freezing would be more effec-

cious, but as it is always consistent to

wait six months for a sharp frost, there

are other means to which one must re-

sort. Corrosive sublimate is excellent.

When every nook and corner of the bed

has been freed from dust—for the *Cimex*

lectularius has an especial predilection

for crevices—apply the poison with a

brush or camel's hair brush, extending

every tiny hole where the germ of an

insect may have been deposited.

Every housekeeper should subject

each bed in the house to a searching

examination three or four times a year,

looking under the ticks on the ticking

and in the seams of that and of the

pillows for any marks of pests. Mr.

Carlyle gives interesting accounts of find-

ing his "bed bugs" infested with these

pests of being kept awake all night at

the sound of their scratching. In a

pleasant house and high-priced inn in
